As can be seen from the Financial Report we were able to complete the Tournament with a small surplus. Had it not been for the strong support from our sponsors this certainly would not have been achieved.

Registrations were slightly down on budget but in view of the shortage of motorised buggies this is probably all we could have catered for.

The "big ticket" items such as the Bruny Island Cruise, the luncheon and the two dinners were large expenditure items but this was offset by savings in other areas such as bus transport and considerable assistance with transport of hand buggies and clubs.

Following the conclusion of the Tournament a debriefing was held and the following matters were raised:

- Too much time elapsed between departure of buses. A review of timetables for future Hornibrook Tournament was suggested
- Although mobile phones are supposedly banned there were defaulters and this could be a problem in the future if not addressed now
- Time taken to play each day exceeded five and a half hours. Perhaps a shot gun start could have alleviated the problem
- A Tasmanian committeeman suggested that the Committee look at the feasibility of conducting the Hornibrook Tournaments on <u>one</u> course only, particularly those that have accommodation in close proximity to the course. He believed that substantial savings could result and be beneficial to the host state and participants

In summary we hope that all participants enjoyed their stay in Tasmania. I think most would agree the accommodation was first class and that the courses were all in excellent condition. The organising committee requested me to pass on their sincere thanks to all teams for their co-operation and participation in what we believed to be a successful tournament.
