From 10:00 am, participants will have a walking tour of the Adelaide Oval, which will finish at about 11:15 am.

Participants will then make their own way (it's about a 20-minute walk) to the **Pink Pig Wine Bar, 50 O'Connell Street, North Adelaide**. MBA SA GC will pay for shared taxis where required.
- 3:30am** **BUSES TO THE HOTEL**
At 3:30pm it will be time to stagger onto the buses for a return trip back to the hotel.

A shotgun start has been arranged for all players. After your round, deliver your clubs to the truck for stacking and return your scorecard to the scorers' desk in the clubhouse. ***If you are leaving the hotel early the next day, you might be advised to take clubs back with you on the bus.***

3:30pm

BUSES TO THE HOTEL

Buses will leave the Golf Club at 3:30pm and 4:00pm.

5:00pm

HOSPITALITY ROOM open from 5:00pm till 7:00pm.

7:00pm

PRESENTATION DINNER

Complete with jacket and tie, players are invited to the Lakeside Function Centre for the Presentation Dinner, a three-course meal, and presentation of all the trophies.

Trophies

Trophies will be awarded as follows

- The M.R. Hornibrook Cup: Awarded to the state with the best average Stableford score over the three days of competition, calculated by using the leading 75% of the players in each state.
- Player with the best aggregate Stableford score over three days.
- Player with the second best aggregate Stableford score over three days.
- Best “A” Grade – Scratch to 12.
- Best “B” Grade – 13 to 19.
- Best “C” Grade – 20 to 36.
- Nearest the Pin. All grades will compete for three nominated holes at each course.
- Player with the best aggregate score in each team.
- Player with the second best aggregate score in each team.

Rules of Conduct

MEMBERSHIP

1. Competitors must conform with the following rules to be eligible to compete in the tournament.
2. All competitors must be financial members of their States/Regional Master Builders' Golf Club or its recognized equivalent.

HANDICAPS

1. All competitors must be financial members of an affiliated golf club of their respective State or Regional Area and have a current Australian handicap as issued by the said club.
2. Competitors to be responsible to supply proof of current handicap if so requested by host State/Regional tournament committee.
3. The match committee of the host State/Regional team will have sole right to adjust any competitor's handicap if it so desires for the duration of the tournament only.
4. Competitors to play off their full current golf handicap. (This however may be adjusted according to the rules of the tournament as laid down by the host State/Regional match committee).
5. The decision of the host State/Regional match committee will be final and binding in all respects.

COMPETITION RULES

1. The rules of play during the tournament will be those as set out by the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St Andrews in vogue at the time; except where they are modified by the local rules of the club in which the competition is played.
2. Local rules of the respective clubs where the tournament is played must be observed at all times.
3. The M.R. Hornibrook Cup will be played for by the competing

States/ Regional teams over three (3) days:

- a. The competition will be individual Stableford.
 - b. The State/Regional team score to be calculated by using 75% of the highest scores of competitors aggregated over the three (3) days and divided by the number of players included in the 75% to arrive at an average. For the purpose of percentage calculation, a State or Regional team shall be the number of players who commence play on the first day, excluding players who give prior notification to the match committee of their inability to play the full tournament.
 - c. After Rule 3(b) has been applied the minimum number of players that count shall be eight (8).
 - d. Percentage of players to be taken to the full number .5 and over, i.e. a team of 14 players \times 75% = 10.5 = 11 players.
4. All competitors are obliged to return their score card immediately on completion of each day's play.
 5. All protests must be in the hands of the host State/Regional Match Committee not later than 30 minutes after competition play ceases each day and all rulings handed down shall be final.
 6. Postponement or cancellation of play due to weather or course conditions will be the decision of the host State/Regional match committee. This is to be made as early as possible on the day concerned. If the tournament cannot continue after two (2) days of play, the winners will be decided by the same method taken over two (2) days in lieu of three (3) days. If only one (1) day's play is possible the tournament will be abandoned.
 7. Competitors must be on the tee ready to start at least 10 minutes before their starting time. Any player arriving late may be relegated to the rear of the field at the discretion of the starter.
 8. Fours to be made up of one (1) host State/Regional player, the remaining players to be from different States/Regions wherever this is possible.

9. The host State/Region may reserve the right to conduct other competitions in conjunction with the M.R. Hornibrook Cup under the same tournament rules, but such an event shall in no way interfere with the standard or the successful running of the cup.
10. All competitors shall be charged a registration fee as laid down for the current tournament, this to be at the discretion of the host State/ Region.
11. The number of players allowed to enter from each State/Regional team shall be 24 and the host State/Regional team be allowed 40. The size of the field to be no more than 184 and whenever a short fall may occur the host State/Regional team has the power to allocate accordingly.
12. Each State/Regional body has the right to veto with regard to new members. Only affiliated State/Regional teams accepted by current members and approved by Master Builders' Australia Ltd. shall participate for the M.R. Hornibrook Cup. The members are: NSW, South Australia, Tasmania, Newcastle, Victoria, Queensland, Gold Coast.
13. A State/Regional team must field a minimum of eight (8) players for three (3) consecutive tournaments prior to being eligible to host a tournament.
14. No other permanent trophy shall be competed for other than the M.R. Hornibrook Cup.
15. Each State/Region to be responsible that all entry nominations with accompanying fees are forwarded to the host State/Region no later than forty five (45) days prior to the start of the tournament and that entries only be lodged on a collective team sheet.
16. Each host State/Region to be responsible for the arrangements of functions and/or entertainment, with a minimum of an opening and a closing function.
17. Alterations, additions and/or deletions to or from these rules can only be made by a properly constituted delegates' meeting or a meeting called for that purpose by the host State/Region at

- a place to be agreed upon. Each State/Region to have one (1) vote only with the Chairman to have the casting vote.
18. Tournament reports are to be prepared each year by the host State/ Region. Other records, if any or as the host State/Region nominates, to be included.
 19. Captain of the host State/Regional team to chair Sunday or any other meeting which may be arranged and each State/Regional team is entitled to have two (2) representatives in attendance at meetings.
 20. The Secretary of the host State/Regional team to circulate minutes of the meetings and tournament results to each State/Regional team and to hand out daily results to each Captain.
 21. Photographs will be provided at host State/Regional team's expense. These will comprise a team photograph for each participant, a Captain's photograph and a group photograph for each State/Regional team.
 22. At least four States/Regions must be represented at the mid-year Captain's meeting for a quorum to be formed.
 23. If expense has been incurred by the host State/Region in regard to the cancellation of a registration, a proportionate refund can be made and that if no expense has been incurred by the host State/Region, a full refund can be allowed.
 24. Ties:
 - a. Should a tie occur for the Individual Aggregate trophy, then a countback to be conducted to determine the winner in accordance with the Rules of Golf.
 - b. Should a tie occur for the MR Hornibrook Aggregate Trophy a countback is to be conducted on the last day's team score.
 25. During the tournament, no play shall take place on any course listed in the tournament until after that day has completed.

The M.R. Hornibrook Cup

1958: It was a happy thought which prompted A.W. (Bert) Baulderstone in May 1958 to request the South Australian Association to place on the Agenda for the 1958 Convention in Perth, the idea of an Annual Golf Tournament between States.

Convention approved requesting interested States to appoint delegates and confer. Subject to fruition it was resolved to call the Tournament the "M.R. Hornibrook Tournament". Victoria was requested to arrange a Golf Week as a trial, future action to be determined by the interest in, and success of the trial week.

1959: Victoria fulfilled their obligation by arranging a competition in June 1959. Victoria, NSW and South Australia were the contestants. The Tournament was an immediate success, its future being assured. Victoria were the victors and became the first holders of the magnificent Cup.

1960: Adelaide was the venue where three matches were played and the local team were the winners.

1961: The scene shifted to Sydney where we saw NSW and Newcastle, as a combined team, take off the Cup.

1962: Queensland entered the Tournament which was staged in Melbourne that year, and won by the host State team.

1963: The Tournament was held in Brisbane. Newcastle as an independent member of the Federation, was represented and became serious contenders for the Cup. On this occasion however, Victoria proved too strong for the opposition.

1964: A return to Adelaide. The traditional spirit of the Tournament was further augmented by keen competition, the advancement of goodwill and the cementing of old and new friendships – Victoria won again!

1965: Sydney hosted this Tournament and much was done by NSW to further augment the new and old friendships of the past. To top it off NSW won the Cup and let it be known they would be hard to beat the next year as well.

1966: A return to Melbourne saw the Victorians win the Cup on their home courses, with several States hot on their heels.

1967: Newcastle hosted the Tournament for the first time, and in doing so set a standard hard to surpass. It also created another first by winning the Cup.

1968: The host State was Queensland and a fine week was had on the “Gold Coast”. Our southern cousins however, proved too good for the Sunshine State and Adelaide took home the bacon.

1969: Keen to retain the Cup (which they did) Adelaide extended the hand of friendship to existing and new members. Stiff competition and renewed friendships were the order of the day and a memorable tournament enjoyed by all.

1970: Back to Sydney – Again the hospitality was second to none and the cup won by New South Wales – a sadder note this year with the death of Sir Manuel.

1971: Newcastle was the venue and their splendid hospitality proved too much for all but the Victorians who were proud to win the coveted trophy.

1972: Victoria was the host State. After stealing a march on the first day, the Southern Australians held off all opposition to take the Cup back to Adelaide.

1973: Tasmania held the Tournament for the first time. Hobart was the venue with the Casino being a BIG attraction. Sydney recorded their fourth win.

1974: Queensland were hosts and the competition was again held at the “Gold Coast”. Queensland was congratulated by all on their first win, and a most successful Tournament.

1975: Hosted and won by Adelaide. Competition was keen and a great time had by all.

1976: New South Wales turn to host the tournament and they did not let us down. As always, old friendships were renewed with players succumbing to the magnificent facilities available on the courses provided. A little bit of local knowledge (and some good golf) saw the NSW team come out the victors.

1977: Newcastle, the ever-popular hosts, did a great job and capped it off with a very narrow win.

1978: Victoria was the hosts with the most and New South Wales the winning team recording their sixth win.

1979: Tasmania hosted their second Tournament in Hobart and celebrated the 21st Anniversary of the “Hornibrook” by recording their first ever win.

1980: South Australia were honoured again to be hosts and wished all participants good golfing and good fellowship. The winners this year were... Adelaide.

1981: Queensland hosted a wonderful week of hospitality on the Gold Coast. Congratulations and best wishes to South Australia who were the winners.

1982: New South Wales did a magnificent job of organising this Tournament but unfortunately the weather let them down. It poured each golf day but NSW received some compensation for their efforts by winning the Cup.

1983: Celebrating the 25th Anniversary at Newcastle, the players were hosted by Newcastle in their usual excellent manner – winners are grinders and South Australia had the widest grin you could imagine on their way home this year.

1984: Victoria hosted the competition in Melbourne and were the ultimate winners.

1985: Hobart hosted their third Tournament, which was won by New South Wales.

1986: Hosted by South Australia and retained by South Australia.

1987: Queensland hosted a splendid Tournament with a return to Brisbane and were rewarded for their efforts with a long awaited win.

1988: Hosts – NSW. Australia Bi-Centenary year, the Tournament was recognised as part of the Celebrations. Sydney is to be congratulated for a job well done and on winning the Tournament.

1989: All players converged on Victoria and once again the courses were in top condition, proving difficult to all except South Australia.

1990: Newcastle were winners all round as hosts and winners.

1991: Hobart turned on its usual top quality programme and demanding courses. Queensland proved too good for the week, taking the Cup back home.

1992: It is always a delight to play golf in Adelaide and this year was no different. The competition was fierce and keen, with Victoria being the fiercest and keenest team overall.

1993: Travelling north to the land of Sunshine and meter maids, players enjoyed Brisbane's hospitality to the max and renewed longstanding friendships and established some new ones. Victoria had no problem transporting the spoils by armoured guard 'south of the border'.

1994: Sydney turned on a great Tournament including the variation of a Shot-Gun Start one day. Good fellowship was enjoyed by all with Tasmania spiriting the spoils back to the homeland for the very first time.

1995: Victoria is consistent with its sand belt course in Melbourne where the quick greens and strong winds blew the Cup right into the hands of the host team.

1996: Newcastle, as hosts, extended a very warm welcome to Gold Coast (Qld) in their first M.R. Hornibrook as a regional State team. Courses were Horizons, Steelworks and Newcastle. Victoria was victorious.

1997: Launceston, Tasmania turned it on to give competitors an insight into the 'top half' of Tasmania and to enjoy the hospitality of the Nation's oldest provincial city. The Gold Coast in only their second appearance in their own right, were worthy winners of the Cup.

1998: South Australia and appropriately Adelaide was the venue for the 40th Tournament. It was South Australia all the way as Bert Baulderstone initiated the first M.R. Hornibrook and South Australian team won this milestone event.

1999: We visited Sydney, the Olympic city and saw firsthand the magnificent Stadium Australia and the modern Olympic Village. Bonnie Doon, NSW and The Lakes Golf courses were most impressive and favoured the Gold Coast.

2000: Gold Coast hosted their first ever Tournament since becoming a member State and did it in grand style – as did Newcastle winning the Cup in a close finish.

2001: Just to "wet" the appetite, Melbourne "showered" us with their hospitality which saw the last day washed out, however a great week was enjoyed by all – Victoria 'came in from the rain' overall winners for the week.

2002: Novocastrian hospitality at its best – first class courses (food & golf), Hunter Reds and pristine white beaches. Featuring quality golf facilities throughout Port Stephens, Hunter Valley and Lake Macquarie regions. Newcastle recorded its second win in three years

2003: A return after 12 years to the southern region of Tasmania around the State Capital of Hobart. Perfect weather and a victory by Victoria ended another memorable week of competition and friendship.

2004: Back in Brisbane, first time since 1993, great weather, great hospitality and some 'challenging courses' saw Victoria run out winners, making it two in a row.

2005: South Australia hosted the Tournament and the weather for golf was perfect, a bit wet on Wednesday. The golf venues are pleasant, played at Kooyonga Golf Club, Glenelg Golf Club and Grange Golf Club all prepared in top condition.

2006: New South Wales were our gracious hosts and we were installed in luxury at Star City. Once again great courses - Camden Lakeside, Terrey Hills and NSW. What more could you ask for? Victoria made it four in a row.

2007: Gold Coast was the host and a competitive tournament was anticipated playing on testing courses, Coolangatta Tweed, Arundel Hills and Robina Woods. Unfortunately the weather intervened and the first and second days play was cancelled due to inclement weather. The final day was completed but, for the first time in 'Hornibrook' history the tournament had to be abandoned due to only one day's play being completed.

2008: Melbourne was the venue for the 50th Anniversary Tournament and a record field of 184 players enjoyed excellent golf conditions and hospitality. Yarra Yarra, Keysborough & Kingston Heath. The Victorian team came out on top.

2009: Newcastle were pleased to host the tournament at Newcastle Golf Club, Pacific Dunes and Hawks Nest. Under the reign of Jack Carr for the last time, Victoria managed to take it out one more time.

2010: Tasmania welcomed players back to Hobart where they played at Royal Hobart, Kingston Beach and Tasmania. The wild wet weather that preceded and followed the tournament abated for the whole week when we enjoyed the most perfect cool summer days. Without Jack Carr, Victoria was without a helm and South Australia stepped in and won the Tournament for the first time since 1998.

2011: For the second time in a row we congratulated the South Australian team who ran out winners in convincing style. The tournament was ably hosted by the Master Builders Queensland Golf Club and the players enjoyed the three Brisbane courses chosen; Indooroopilly Golf Club – River Course, Carbrook Golf Club (home of the Shark Lake challenge) and Pacific Golf Club.

2012: South Australia pulled off the ultimate double: an outstanding job as hosts of the 54th Tournament, rewarded with a hat-trick of tournament wins... congratulations all around. The courses played ~ Kooyonga, Grange (West Course) and Glenelg proved very challenging, evidenced by the conservative scoring throughout the event...

2013: New South Wales raised the bar with an exceptional effort as hosts of the 55th Tournament. The venues ~ St Michael's, Liverpool GC and Macquarie Links ~ were very demanding, as shown by the averaged scores. South Australia continued their strong run, with a fourth consecutive tournament win, albeit by a very narrow margin over the hosts... congratulations all round.

2014: Gold Coast. Winners, Gold Coast.

2015: Victoria. Winners, Gold Coast.

2016: Newcastle – Hunter Valley. A fantastic tournament with great courses played being Vintage, Cypress Lakes and Hunter Valley. Moving into the wine region did not seem to affect many players. The venue and accommodation chosen by the N MBA GC did their club proud. Winners: Gold Coast.

2017: Tasmania – Hobart. Tassie certainly turned on the weather for interstate visitors. Courses played were Claremont (Monday), Tasmania (Tuesday) and Royal Hobart (Thursday), which were all in great condition. The Wednesday Lay Day was received well by those that attended – a two-hour trip in a ferry around Hobart Harbour ending at the Bellerive wharf. Buses then transported us to the Coal Valley Vineyard. A superb location and a 35 degree day! Winners: Victoria (closely followed by NSW).

2018: Brisbane. The 60th M.R. Hornibrook was held in Brisbane and was complete with challenges and milestones to make it a memorable event. Brisbane was deluged with significant rain immediately before the tournament and several courses were closed as a result. Fortunately, the chosen courses, Wynnun, Oxley and Gales allowed play even with the use of motorized buggies. For the first time in 27 years, Queensland managed the win.
